A. Key Regulations, DUSD Policy & Internal Control Guidelines workshop Received several handouts

Beneficial to have the meeting at the beginning of the year

- Officers should not be a staff member, especially the Treasurer should not be a staff member

PFCs should not be signing contracts for events held during school hours. No fundraising at elementary schools

The handbook has lots of information regarding the treasurer position
